
Sarah Akers

Tony Huck is a Marist icon and a symbol of humility. After 35 years of selfless service and contribution to the Marist community, he deserves recognition and our thanks as he retires this year. However, Huck has requested that his retirement be a quiet process, a reflection of his heart.

Throughout the years Huck has quietly served the community with selflessness. Huck's time at Marist has been a blessing and his contributions will be missed. Huck came from humble beginnings. He was born in the small town of Methuen, Massachusetts in what he calls a "simpler time." After teaching in Chicago, Huck was presented with the opportunity to travel with some Marist Brothers to the West Coast, a side of the country Huck had never seen. Desiring to embark on a new adventure and embrace his calling to serve, Huck said "yes" with enthusiasm and travelled to Oregon.

Huck fell in love with the Willamette Valley: the mountains, the coast, the trees, the rivers, and the change of pace from bustling, industrial Chicago. Upon arriving in Eugene, Huck witnessed the tight community the Marist Brothers had in the residency.

Huck was captivated and moved to Oregon where he taught biology and religion classes at Marist High School for 10 years, before taking a sixmonth sabbatical in Rome. During this sabbatical, Huck was informed that his brother had died

Huck devoted his heart to a full time teaching career of physical science and algebra at Marist High School in Eugene, and as Huck says, "the rest is history."

Huck says he "feels blessed" to work at Marist and is "gonna miss it." He loves seeing over the years "faces who keep coming back" to "support the community" and believes this sense of community is truly what makes Marist unique.

After looking back on his change and adventure-filled life, Huck truly believes that "as confusing as life can be...you have to learn to go with the flow."

Huck is far more than a Network Assistant or the man that command students to not eat in the ARC. He is a Marist icon, symbol of humility, man of God and selfless servant. Track and Field earns a State Title at the OSAA State Championships

This past weekend Hayward Field was an exciting place to be for Marist track and

in 2nd place. "There was a really special bond on the relay team this year, we all connected through the baton," Jones said.

In an almost too close to call race sophomore Jordan Pifer took field fans as schools from across 7th place and junior Will Knowlton placed 8th in the 800m. Both broke two minutes for the first time in their track careers.

The Marist boys took the meet by storm earning their first ever 5A State Title by outperforming the form charts all day. The next closest team was Lebanon who finished 21 points behind the Spartans. The girls tied for 18th place with Dallas and Lebanon.

Senior Liam Henshaw had a successful meet earning 1st in pole vault, the long jump, and in the 110m high hurdles along with 5th place in the triple jump with some of his best jumps all year including jumping 15 feet 8 inches to set a new pole vault state meet record.

"I am satisfied," said Henshaw with a smile, "especially after coming back from an ankle injury."

In one of the most exciting races of the day, the boys 4x100m relay team of seniors Andrew Park and Adam Houser and sophomores Dustin Jones and Trae Gould finished just behind West Albany

Sophomore Dustin Jones was 2nd in the 400m and placed 5th in the 200m. Junior Trevor Konrady took 8th in javelin just 6" off of the 5th place throw.

Senior J.P. Kiefer placed 5th in the 3000m on Friday followed by sophomore Luke Littleton who placed 10th. Kiefer then placed 6th in the 1500m on Saturday and sophomore Clark Embleton placed 11th. The team of Kiefer, Houser, Gould and Jones placed 7th in the 4x400m relay.

Marist had two medalists from the girls team: senior Bri Kempf took 2nd in the 100m hurdles and sophomore Natalie Hakala took 6th in the 800m.

Juniors Carley Weixelman, Anne Yates, Claire Farrington, and Hakala placed 10th in the 4x100m relay with a season best time of 51.09 seconds.
