Track & field continues a successful season; boys win the Summit Invitational

led by senior Liam Henshaw, the boys track team scored in every event but high jump and the 100 meters, leading them to victory at the Summit Invitational in Bend, Oregon last weekend.

Marist beat out 15 other schools from Oregon, Washington and Idaho, including the reigning state champion, Summit.

Junior Jacob Hubbard won the shot put - achieving 9th in the state for 5A - and sophomore Dustin Jones took first in the 400 meters -

ranking him 2nd in the state for 5A - contributing to the meet victory.

Henshaw tied his personal best record in the pole vault - clearing 15' 6" - and went 22-3 in the long jump, helping the Spartans leap into first with a victory of 123-109 over Capital High School of Idaho. Henshaw, a future Duck, leads the 5A state in pole vault and high hurdles along with being in the top ten in all jumping events.

Sophomore Luke Littleton took 3rd in the 3,000 meters while sophomore Austin Korth secured 4th in both the high and low hur-

dles. Both boys relay teams ran their fastest times this season.

Other Marist competitors in the top ten in state in their events are Jacob Hubbard, Trae Gould, Adam Houser, Trevor Coleman, Clark Embleton, J.P. Kiefer, Dustin Jones, and Brianna Kempf.

Senior Bri Kempf took 2nd in both high and low hurdles, while sophomore Natalie Hakala also took 2nd in the 800 meters, leading the girls to 7th place overall.

The top two in each event are competing in the Dean Nice Invitational in Gresham this afternoon.
