

Last Wednesday, the Marist cross country team traveled to the 5A Midwestern League Championships in Central Point, along with six other teams to compete for a chance to go to state. With a score of 38, the Marist varsity boys finished in 2nd place behind the Crater Comets, qualifying the team for the 5A State Championships at LCC next Saturday, Oct. 31.

On the girls side, juniors Booy Rogers and Hope Powell both placed in the top seven, earning them a place in the State Championships as well.

The JV boys placed 1st with a score of 29, while JV girls tied for 3rd with

a score of 61.

Last Thursday, the varsity girls soccer secured their 5A Midwestern League Champion title after winning against previously undefeated Ashland 3-1. The first round of playoffs for the girls will be Tuesday, Nov. 3.

Last Tuesday evening the varsity volleyball team secured their 5A Midwestern League Champion title after beating the North Eugene Highlanders away. The first round of playoffs will be a home game on Saturday, Oct. 31.

The water polo team lost to South Albany in Tuesday’s night’s senior recognition game. The Spartans will play in their last regular season game of the season against the Ashland Grizzlies this evening at 6:15 p.m. in Cottage Grove.
