Over Spring Break, the 200 and 400 wings were embellished with vinyl cut decals of Bible verses. The decals were manufactured and installed by Richard Knox from Visual Concepts.

The Art and Environment Committee, made up of Marist staff, sent submissions to theology teacher, and head of the committee Julie Ferrari, who decided on which verses to put on the walls.

The planning for the quotes began in 2011, the same year the committee began planning for the historical display in the front office. The front

office project was complete in September of 2013.

The quotes correspond with the classrooms in each hallway. The 400 and literature wing has a quote from John 1:1, "In the beginning, there was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

The 200 and history wing has a quote from Micah 6:8, "You have been told what is good and what the Lord requires of you. Only to do justice and love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God."

Long term, the committee plans to have 13 quotes around the school, and hopefully relevant pictures as well.

Construction Finish in Sight

The new science wing has made a huge leap towards completion within the last month.

According to Rick Gardner, director of athletics and facilities, the exterior of the building is being painted, the electrical finished, the plumbing completed, and the ventilation installed.

There is still work to be done on landscaping, restrooms and technology installation.

Construction is still on schedule to be finished in late

April. However, it is still in question whether or not the teachers will be moved in this year.

As a part of the advancement project, parts of the old building are getting improvements. Over Spring Break holes in the breezeway ceilings were patched, so that water will no longer leak onto walkways during heavy rain. Also as part of the overhaul of the science wing one of the existing classrooms will be renovated to match the new building. The floor tiles of one classroom and the department vent hood were removed as part of asbestos abatement.
