### Celebrating Marist's 3rd class of athletic standouts

ast Friday evening Marist inducted seven ✓ new members into its 3rd annual Athletic Hall of Fame in a fancy white table cloth event.

Of the seven inductees, it is fitting that one in particular is being inducted on the 50th anniversary of Title IX. A St. Francis High School grad, Cathy (Gaughan) Mant '68 was pushing boundaries shortly before Title IX changed the world of education and athletics for women forever.

During Mant's senior year, she was the only girl on the boys golf team – the Saints didn't have a girls golf team – and in her acceptance speech, Mant said she remembers beating most of those boys. Mant went on to

become an All-American golfer at Arizona State University, even winning the NCAA championship for women in 1970. She played 11 years in the LPGA and spent the remainder of her career coaching and serving on golf administrative boards.

The rest of the inductees were also honored for their unique contributions to athletics throughout the years.

The 1946 St. Mary's football team was honored for being state champions and the first parochial football team in Oregon to win a state championship. Ted Brandt '47, one of the two team members to accept the award, is the greatgrandfather of sophomore Alexa Brandt.

The 1980 girls track and field team was

honored for not only winning a team trophy but also multiple individual champions.

Scott Halbrook '81, who was honored posthumously, was a part of multiple state championships as a three-sport athlete and played one year for the Beavers.

Kendel Drew '98 was honored for being a four-year state singles champion in tennis.

Terry Lande was honored for coaching his girls basketball teams to a 100-game winning streak.

Dustin Waldron '08 was honored for his achievements as a three-sport athlete along with playing in college and the NFL.
