It was a record setting performance on Saturday as the girls 400 free relay team set a new school record with a time of 3:41.08 and a 3rd place finish. The girls placed 5th or higher in all three relays en route to a 5th place finish at the 5A OSAA State Meet.

Nine swimmers made their way to the meet at Mt. Hood Aquatics. Two boys and seven girls competed, and placed highly in their respective events. Freshman Lauren
