

Speaking was Rebecca Fitkin, an employee from Looking Glass Community Services, a non-profit geared towards helping kids with challenges involving educational issues, behavioral problems, drug addiction, and homelessness. Diana Janz also spoke, the founder and president of Hope Ranch Ministries, an organization created to help victim of human trafficking a safe place to heal.

Speaking last was Pamela Kinnion founder of High Hope Haven, an organization that teaches horseman-
